Help Students Persist in the Face of Challenges

Share Information about Systems Issues

Attends all court hearings, meetings called by DHS and the child's school.

"Check" data are selected indicators of alterable risk for disengagement

- Absences and/ortardiness
- Grades
- Credits accrued
- Missing assignments
- Behavioral referrals

Students' data generally accessed through

- Online student information system
- Student records
- School personnel such as attendance clerks and teachers

Student's performance checked

At least monthly for students at risk of becoming disengaged
Biweekly if the student is considered high risk

Monitoring form used

- As a communication tool with students, parents, and teachers
- To demonstrate student progress over time
- To monitor fidelity of implementation

Basic Interventions

Share "Check" Information

Provide regular feedback

Discuss staying in school

Problem Solve about risk

Facilitate social skills training

Facilitate participation in school or community activity

Facilitate tutoring

Facilitate participation in small group instruction for meeting state standards

Teach problem solving skills

Teach organization and study skills

Arrange an alternative to suspension

Utilize data

- Follow established procedures
- •Gather monthly data and report data
- Participate in all scheduled case conferences

Connect Services

- Plan introductions
- Maintain communication
- Implement interventions
- Focus on relationship
- Engages families in academic efforts
- Focus on academics
- Address personal and case problems

Representative for the child

- Prepare a written report
- Appear in Court at all hearings with recommendations
- Point out concerns
- •Ensure the child's best interests are being represented
- Support student mobility

Best Interest of the Child

- Utilize as many factors as possible
- Participate in any planning or treatment team meetings
- Monitor the development and/or revisions of a case plan
- Review the service plan with workers
- Always consider the child's best interests in the community
